"Meet the Robinsons"

Clip #1 - Orphan Response A

- 1. What was Lewis hoping would get him adopted? Did it work?**

"Go show them how special you are."

"All it takes is some imagination and a little science and we can make the world a better place." he's hoping in his ability

- 2. How did rejection make him feel?**

"I'm so sorry!" - shame, weighed down with guilt

"124 adoption interviews" - disappointment, hopeless

"I have no future. No one wants me."

- 3. What gave Lewis a glimmer of hope?**

"My real mom is the only one who's ever wanted me." he is hoping in unconditional love, yet it is wishful thinking (not reasonable)

Clip #2 - Orphan Response B

- 1. How was Goob's response similar to Lewis'?**

"Today, people called me names." shame

"I missed the winning catch." guilt, disappointment, hopeless

- 2. Where did Goob place his hope?**

"Let it fester and boil inside of you. Let hate be your ally." blame & grudge - momentary comfort of a steak

Clip #3 - From Orphan to Child

- 1. Lewis changed. What made the difference?**

"I'm really happy you're safe." grace was given to Lewis

"You are a special kid, one of a kind." he didn't have to have it all together to be accepted by this family... they just loved him, forgiving his faults - this was good news

"The truth is, we love having you... You really have to say... What do ya say, do you wanna be a Robinson?" he is offered adoption

- 2. Describe Lewis' response (attitude & actions) in this clip?**

"You sacrificed so much for me..." gratitude, happiness

[his face...and head nod] a mixture of belief and unbelief

What does this movie teach us about our relationship with God?

Bad News for Spiritual Orphans

Two realities:

1. We are sinners. God is holy and must punish sin.

Romans 3:10-12

2. We are born spiritual orphans... alienated from God.

Romans 3:13-19

Two responses:

1. **Live** by being bad (like Goob)

Romans 3:10-19 - trying to avoid God altogether, atheists, pleasure

2. **Live** by being good (like Lewis)

Romans 3:20 - trying to earn righteousness

Good News for Spiritual Orphans

One reality:

God is justifying sinners and adopting orphans.

Romans 3:21-24

Justification is the legal part. Adoption is the relational part.

All people can be forgiven, given righteousness through faith in Christ Jesus. And it is a free gift of grace!

One response:

Hope in the good character and promises of a loving Heavenly Father, **Trust** in Jesus as your savior and **Live** as adopted children!

Romans 8:12-17

SMALL GROUP #3

Living as Adopted Children of God

Warm-up

1. Imagine that God the Father is thinking about you right now. **What do you honestly feel he's thinking about you?**
Disappointed, sad, embarrassed, angry, doesn't really care
2. Is your answer the truth? If you are a Christian, what does the Bible say God is thinking about you?
Refer to small group #2.
3. How does your answer to the first question affect the way you live your daily life in relationship to God?
4. How could believing the answer to the second question radically change your life?

Exercise

Christians **are** children of God, forgiven and dearly loved. Nothing can change that truth. But too often they live as though they were orphans, trying to find affirmation and their very worth from their good works, or finding satisfaction from someplace other than their Father. The list on the next page will help you see to what extent that might be happening to you.

1. Place a number next to each statement (Do ORPHAN side first).

- 1 = This rarely describes me.
- 2 = This describes me occasionally.
- 3 = This is often true of me.

2. Underline words or phrases that most apply to you.
3. Don't spend a lot of time thinking about each one. Go with your gut feeling and move on to the next one.

Discuss - Do this after everyone has finished numbering their chart.

Share your top 3 from each column. How can you move from living as a spiritual orphan to living more as a son or daughter?

Some of us try to avoid and ignore God.

Lewis tried to overcome being an orphan by being good.

Some of us try to impress and manipulate God

3. How have you personally responded to the good news that God has made a way for sinners to be forgiven and brought into his family through adoption?

Refer to the notes from the lesson tonight. Read John 1:12.

3. Take a few moments to quietly think and pray individually.

SMALL GROUP #2

What is Spiritual Adoption?

Theology Study

“What is Adoption?” Adoption is an act of God’s free grace, whereby we are received into the number, and have a right to all the privileges of the sons of God” (Shorter Catechism #34).

Use the catechism above to answer these theology questions.

1. Is spiritual adoption a process? No. It is a one-time act. You can’t be any more or less adopted than you already are through faith in Jesus. Christians are legally adopted through justification and after the resurrection of the dead, they will be physically present with God the Father in the new heavens and new earth forever & ever.

2. What is a Christian’s role in adoption? Recipient of God’s grace

3. What is the immediate result of adoption? Christians are brought into the number of those who are God’s children. They have instant access to God as children and receive all the rights and privileges of the sons of God.

Bible Study

READ Deuteronomy 7:6-11

1. List the words this passage uses to describe God’s people.

holy to the Lord, chosen, treasured possession, loved promised, fewest of all people, redeemed, etc.

2. Why did God choose to adopt Israel?

because the Lord loved them

because the Lord is keeping the oath that he swore

3. List the words this passage uses to describe God.

loving, faithful, steadfast, not slack to repay evil, chooser promise-keeper, redeemer, etc.

READ Romans 8:1, 12-17

1. How does verse 1 connect to verses 12-17?

Christians have been forgiven of their sins and there is no condemnation for them. So, they owe God their life!

2. List the attitudes and actions that should characterize sons.

live according to the Spirit

put to death the deeds of the body

they do not fear or live enslaved to sin - desires are changed

they call God their “Abba and Father” - there is intimacy

hope in the eternal promise of being heirs, willing to suffer

READ Mark 1:9-11 and Galatians 4:4-7

1. What does the Father say about Jesus?

you are my Son in whom “I am well pleased”

2. What does the Father say about his adopted children?

“you are no longer a slave, but a son”

“you are redeemed and adopted as my son or daughter”

“with you I am well pleased!”

3. How can God say that about sinful people?

God the Father says this of Christians because they have been given the Spirit of his Son into their hearts.

READ Ephesians 1:3-14

1. List the spiritual blessings Christians receive in Christ as adopted children.

he didn’t give them *some* spiritual blessings, but “every”

chosen, holy and blameless before him, predestined

adopted as sons, redemption, forgiveness

riches of his grace were lavished on them

an inheritance, hope in Christ, Holy Spirit

word of truth, the gospel of salvation, etc.
